Top Tips for Taking Tests

1. **Get enough sleep before the test** – You will feel positive and energetic. Most important, your memory will be much better!
2. **Read through the test first** – this will help you to see how much you must do. Then, you can plan your time properly.
3. **Answer questions in any order** – If you don't know an answer, skip it. Return to that question later.
4. **Relax!** – If you worry, you may not do well. Take a break for 30 seconds. Close your eyes and imagine a relaxing place.
5. **Manage your time** – Check the clock. If you have too little time, it is better to guess. Try not to leave blank answers.
6. **Check!** – If you finish early, try to check over your answers.

EIKEN Grades 1, Pre-1, 2, Pre-2 and 3 have changed.

Briefly, some of the exam times will be extended to accommodate new writing sections. Many things have changed. Students may need to **summarize a text**, or **reply to an email** (Grade 3/pre-2).
